

Promoting Adaptation to Changing Coasts


PACCo, Promoting Adaptation to Changing Coasts, is a cross-border project supported by the Interreg V A France (Channel) England programme.

The main objective of the PACCo project is to demonstrate that it is possible to carry out adaptation to climate change in a preventive way in estuarine areas, working with all relevant stakeholders, bringing a range of benefits to the populations of these coastal areas.


The project focuses on two pilot sites: the Lower Otter Valley, Devon, England and the Lower Saâne Valley, Normandy, France.
